Chapter 3 (Land Access) of the *Mineral and Energy Resources (Common Provisions) Act 2014* allows a party that has not entered into a conduct and compensation agreement to request arbitration to decide a dispute.

Use this form if you want to request a resource authority holder or eligible claimant participate in arbitration to decide a dispute about the negotiation of a conduct and compensation agreement or deferral agreement. If the arbitration request is accepted the parties cannot apply to the Land Court under section 96 to decide the dispute.

You can give this form after:

- a party gave the other party a negotiation notice to negotiate the resolution of a dispute and at the end of the minimum negotiation period the parties have not negotiated a conduct and compensation agreement or deferral agreement; or
- a party gave the other party an ADR election notice seeking to negotiate to resolve a dispute and at the end of the ADR period (s 89) the parties have not entered into a conduct and compensation agreement.
