

The Department of Natural Resources and Mines (DNRM) has initiated a project to determine its future approach to how property boundary, surveying and addressing data is created, stored and provided to different customers to use in their businesses.

Over the coming six months the project will focus on:

- 1. Defining a new business model, including conducting a series of workshops with surveyors, local governments, other government departments, utility providers and other spatial information stakeholders.
- 2. Implementing improvements to eSurvey to enhance your migration to lodging survey plans digitally.

These project activities will require involvement from the surveying industry. A Surveying Focus group is being established to discuss required capabilities and functionality of a new business model, shape the delivery of enhancements to eSurvey and provide input into improvements within the scope of the project. The project may also establish other Industry Focus groups. Members will be responsible for sharing the outcomes of the group's work with their organisations and industry colleagues. Defining and then implementing this type of transformational change is a multi-year program of work, and we are currently in the planning stage. Because of the size and complexity of the project, a different approach to introducing change is being adopted. A dedicated project management team has been appointed who are working with the 3dQLD Taskforce and are collaborating with business leaders from various industries. The project itself is governed by a project board, of which I am member.

I will continue to keep you abreast of the progress of this work and provide information on opportunities for further involvement.
