EDME Calibration Baseline Certification

The Queensland EDME baselines are observed (recertification) and new Regulation 13 certificates issued for the baselines, every two years. Historically the baselines were all measured in the one field campaign in the same year.

The process has now changed in that the baselines have been divided into two campaigns, Northern and Southern and each will be done on alternate years. The Southern baselines on the even calendar years and the Northern on the odd years.

It is expected that the field campaigns will still be undertaken in August/September with the new Regulation 13 certificate issued shortly after. Where practicable please avoid performing EDME tests around the time that baselines are scheduled for recertification.

The Department has recently finalised the recertification of the Southern baselines. The Goonyella baseline was also recertified due to confirmed pillar movement. The new Regulation 13 certificates and calibration software are available on the Department of Resources (Resources) webpage.

Goonyella will be recertified again in 2023 as part of the Northern EDM Tour.

There have been a significant number of instances where inappropriate disclaimers have been placed on identification survey plans. Surveyors are reminded of CSR 3.4.1 which includes the following.

A survey plan must not include any statement which may infer that the accuracy of the survey does not comply with surveying standards (for example, a disclaimer referring to the 'fitness for

Survey Audit Modernisation

Thanks to those individuals and the Surveying Industry Associations for providing comments on the draft changes to modernise survey auditing. Due to the 80+ responses received, the implementation of the project has been delayed. The Project Team will soon be reviewing the current project plan and implementation schedule and will advise of the new schedule, this will include further consultation with the industry commencing in early 2023.

Review of the Cadastral Survey Requirements (CSR)

The CSR annual review is progressing well. Further consultation with the Surveying Reference Group, and distribution of a consultation draft to the industry of the proposed CSR version 8.1 will occur early in 2023. The timing for the release of the new version will be influenced by the passage of the Land and Other Legislation Amendment Bill 2022 which is anticipated to occur early next year.
